The City of Pembroke's Emergency Control Group continues to meet and the City remains under a state of emergency as it continues in the recovery phase associated with recent flooding.

The City's focus now turns to cleanup and returning to normal operations throughout Pembroke as soon as possible. We are working on coordinating volunteers and the timelines for work on public lands. If you are interested in volunteering and would like to be on the call list, please contact the City at 613-735-6821 ext. 1409. For safety reasons, we ask people not to start any debris pickup adjacent to public lands until coordinated through the City.

We would also like to remind the public the Marina and Waterfront Park are closed and will remain as such until the current cleanup underway is at a point where safe usage of these areas is possible. Launching of boats at the Pembroke Marina is currently prohibited, but the Ottawa River is again open to boating traffic as authorized by Transport Canada. A further update will be provided during the week of June 9, at which time a date for launching and marina access is expected to be available.
