### **Council Briefs**

The following actions were taken at the Committee and Council meetings of Tuesday, Jan. 7, 2020:

#### **Finance & Administration Committee:**

#### **Engineering Design & Contract Administration Services for Townline Lift Station – Forcemain Upgrades and Generator Replacement for Proposal No. P-19-11**

### **Council Meeting:**

#### **By-Laws:**

#### **2020-01 – Borrowing By-law**

Passed and Enacted

Explanatory Note:

This By-law authorizes temporary borrowing to meet current expenditures in 2020.

#### **2020-02 – Interim Tax Levy for 2020**

Passed and Enacted

Explanatory Note:

This By-law authorizes staff to issue interim tax bills for all rateable properties in the municipality.

#### **2020-03 – Eastern Ontario Regional Network (EORN)**

Passed and Enacted

Explanatory Note:

This By-law authorizes the Mayor and the CAO to sign the municipal contribution agreement between the City of Pembroke, the Eastern Ontario Wardens' Caucus (EOWC), the Eastern Ontario Regional Network (EORN), and the Eastern Ontario Mayors' Committee (EOMC) in support of the Eastern Ontario cell gap project.

Explanatory Note:

The City of Pembroke in financial partnership with cities and counties across Eastern Ontario and the provincial and federal governments address cellular dead zones across Eastern Ontario.

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### **2020-04 – Amend Parking By-Law 2005 55 (Two Hour Parking)**

Passed and Enacted

Explanatory Note:

This By-law amends By-law 2005-55, a By-law to regulate and control the parking of vehicles in the City of Pembroke, by adding the following:

(d) The provisions of this by-law with respect to parking meters shall permit two-hour free parking from Monday to Saturday from Jan. 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020 and apply to vehicles parked or standing upon public streets where parking meters have been installed in the following locations:

- Pembroke Street West (between Mackay Street and Hincks Street);
- Victoria Street;
- Albert Street;
- Prince Street;
- Alexander Street;
- Agnes Street;
- Frank Nighbor Street;
- Church Street (between Pembroke Street West and Renfrew Street);
- Moffat Street (between Pembroke Street West and Renfrew Street); and
- Shamrock Lot.

Also:

That Schedule “E” – TWO HOUR PARKING ZONES of By-law 2005-55 be amended by adding thereto the following:

Two-hour free parking from Monday to Saturday from January 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020 shall be permitted and apply to vehicles parked or standing upon public streets where parking meters have been installed in the following locations:

- Pembroke Street West (between Mackay Street and Hincks Street);
- Victoria Street;
- Albert Street;
- Prince Street;
- Alexander Street;
- Agnes Street;
- Frank Nighbor Street;
- Church Street (between Pembroke Street West and Renfrew Street);
- Moffat Street (between Pembroke Street West and Renfrew Street); and
- Shamrock Lot

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
