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City of Pembroke launches survey to gather input on public transit

The City of Pembroke is presently conducting a transit feasibility study which will determine an optimal transit solution, if any, for its residents, businesses, and visitors. The municipality has launched a survey to gather input from the public. The purpose of this survey is to collect information from the public relating to their potential use and support for a local transit service. The survey is [available online](#) or physical copies can be completed at City Hall, the Pembroke Public Library, the County of Renfrew administration building, the 50+ Active Living Centre, the Kinsmen Pool, the Parks and Recreation office at the Pembroke Memorial Centre, or any of the city's long-term care homes or assisted living facilities.

It is strongly suggested that all respondents read the additional public information about the ongoing transit feasibility study which can be found on the [City's website](#) (or as a physical copy in any of the above locations) before taking the survey.

The survey will be open until September 19, 2021 and responses from the public will help to inform future decisions regarding local transit.
